

Insurance Record Keeping Advice for Congregations

For a variety of reasons, there have been a lot of lawsuits against congregations, synods and the ELCA in the past year. While none of us think that it could happen to us, it can happen and is happening to congregations across the ELCA, even forcing some to declare bankruptcy. Some of these are due the removal or extension of statute of limitations on reporting sexual misconduct in states around

the country. But the door remains open on lawsuits regarding Covid as well as other liability issues (especially consider this if you host a daycare or preschool).

Perhaps one thing your congregation and its council can do during these times is to prepare yourselves should that eventuality come knocking on the door. Start with your insurance coverage and explore what coverage you have now as well the policies you had in the past, including the way past. Neither the Synod office nor the Churchwide office maintain insurance records for congregations; you need to keep and maintain accurate insurance records yourselves.

The resources on the <u>risk management resource page</u> and the specific guidelines for maintain insurance records <u>(attached here)</u> can help you.

To the extent congregations do not have good historic records, the best places to look for this material (in rough order) are: their insurance files and correspondence, current broker, past broker(s), council minutes, annual reports, congregation meeting minutes, correspondence related to lawsuits, bank records, (cancelled checks), etc.

And if you are not able to put together good historical records of insurance, you should start keeping those records now. The best time to plant a tree was 20 years ago; the second-best time is now.

Re: Lutefisk and other Fall Harvest Dinners. I hope this goes without saying but...

Dear Friends in Christ,

One of the joyful events that happens each Fall in many of our congregations are the Lutefisk, Meatball or other Fall Harvest dinners. These are often wonderful events of fellowship, celebrating the end of harvest, and honoring the heritage of some of our cultural ancestors.

However, this year is different. The pandemic is hitting Montana and N. Wyoming hard and numbers of active cases are rising exponentially. Moving from town to town and gathering in fellowship halls for big meals is just not a safe or good option right now. (Unless someone has determined that Lutefisk does indeed kill the coronavirus.) Even delivering these meals or doing some sort of take-out option could run high risks for our most vulnerable populations without the proper food preparation and delivery methods that are being used by restaurants.

So my prayer and hope is that you as pastors, councils and congregations are choosing to make the wise and loving decision NOT to hold your congregational Fall meal this year and instead finding other ways to come together to thank God for the harvest. And if you have not chosen that path, I encourage (beg) you to reconsider. Loving one another as we love ourselves and choosing NOT to spread this virus in big attendance events of unmasked eating in unventilated spaces, no matter how distanced we are, is the most loving thing we can do for our members, communities and hospitals which are already overflowing. Love of neighbor is our core Christian value above all others. So let's not be a part of the problem, but a part of the solution instead. Again I remind you of these words from Paul: "For you were called to freedom, brothers and sisters; only do not use your freedom as an opportunity for self-indulgence, but through love serve one another." (Gal 5:13)
