

Words from the Bishop: Mountain Preacher



He preached the gospel to me without even knowing it. I was over half-way up the trail to Firebrand Pass in Glacier Park and it had been a long slog. The trail had been steep with more "up" to come. It was covered with overgrown foliage making it hard to see the roots and stones I kept tripping over. The higher I climbed, the harder it was to breath. I was losing my will to keep going even though I knew I was just getting to best part – the view!

I had stopped to sit on a stump to rest and eat a snack when he came down the trail toward me. "How's it going?" he

asked. "Oh, good," I lied. "Slow but sure." He didn't hear the lie. Or maybe he did. For the next

thing he said was just what I needed to hear. "Yeah, that's the way. I try to enjoy every step." And then he hiked on.

Enjoy every step?! That was not something I was doing. I was suffering each step. Groaning some steps; losing hope on other steps. And stopping every 10 steps to rest. I was tired, frustrated and in pain. I was not enjoying anything.

But not being one to give up, I decided to give it a try and practice enjoying every step. So I started up again, this time slowing down. I focused on the trail and the flowers and the new view each step brought to my eyes. I breathed evenly and with intention instead of gasping and groaning. I stopped worrying about getting to my destination and just tried to enjoy each step. And it worked – mostly. I started to enjoy every step and the whole hike more fully.
